
- Make sure costumes have bright colors and reflective surfaces so they can be seen by cars from a safe distance. Costumes should also have large eyeholes so children can easily see where they are going. Face paint is an excellent substitute for a mask.
- Trick or treaters should always travel in groups and have at least one adult with them for safety.
- Make sure that each group has at least one flashlight and one fully charged cell phone. Light sticks are always popular with kids, so try to give each child one to carry.
- Only go trick or treating in neighborhoods or to houses that you know.
- Make sure that someone not with your trick or treating group knows your planned route, who is in your group, what time you are leaving, and what time you plan to return.
- Keep your group together. Trick or treating and wearing costumes is always exciting, but don't lose track of your group. It's a good idea to stop after every few houses to make sure that everyone is together.
- Before the children dig into their goodies, make sure an adult inspects all candy.
 Discard any that has been opened or looks suspicious.

Did you Know?

The Chesterfield County Police Department participates in the SmartWater CSI program. This program provides traceable liquids that contain a unique forensic code that can be applied to many items of value. This invisible liquid

can only be viewed under a unique ultraviolet light frequency.

Upon the recovery of any stolen property marked with SmartWater, a small fragment of SmartWater from the stolen property is sent to SmartWater's forensic lab, where it is analyzed to identify an owner. Thieves that target SmartWater-marked items have a greater risk of successful prosecution.
